Problems with current system*

- Resubmissions are treated “independently”
 - ***Hard work of current PC is “wasted”*** to future committees when paper rejected
 - ***Authors often do not address serious problems*** found, hoping new PC will not notice
 - ***No archival of reviews/discussion*** (useful even for accepted papers, or future submissions to journals)

*Disclaimer: system works (even well!) despite what goes above...

Problems with current system*

- **Journal culture is completely “messed up”**
 - ***No incentive to be reviewer*** (leads to **poor reviews**, long publication cycle, etc.)
 - ***Non-uniform quality of papers*** (invited papers from TCC, CRYPTO, EC vs. “only good enough for JoC”)
 - ***Poor quality control: single “author-chosen” editor*** makes accept/reject decisions based on 2-3 reviews
 - ***No incentive to submit in US*** (conference culture)
 - ***Nobody reads JoC*** (e.g., eprint is good enough)

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None of these apply to current conferences!

- ***“Fun” to be reviewer*** (credit to PC members, external reviews read/appreciated by a large PC)
—leads to decent-to-excellent review quality*
- ***Best papers are selected by a large group of people,***
applying the same uniform principles in the “open”
- ***Quick publication cycle & knowledge dissimilation***
- ***Leads to prestige + immediate impact***

*Except for recent editions of Eurocrypt

But...

- ***Not expected to check correctness thoroughly***
 - unlike journals (supposedly 😊)
- ***Full version not enforced***
 - and sometimes never appears or gets checked!
- ***Leads to occasional serious mistakes and questions confidence in the system***

New Proposed System

- ***A single portal for all IACR papers***

- Merges together IACR conferences, JoC, Eprint and newly created **Journal of IACR (JoI)**.
- Only one “paper directory”** (multiple versions OK)
- Modulo access control, **all reviews/discussions stick**
- Keeps current submission process for conferences, **with all the “positives”** (no messing with a good thing!)
- Adds a simple way to submit to JoI (either directly or **as “by-product” of conference submission**)

Initial Submission

- Can submit to Eprint, Jol and/or IACR Conference
- **Eprint**: accepted unrefereed (modulo syntax, like now)
- **Conference**: only before deadline + goes to conference PC
 - Same reviewing process as now, but reviews stick for *resubmissions*!
 - If *also* submitted to Jol, additionally decide “Jol accept/reject” (conference accepts are automatically Jol accepted, *some* rejects as well)
- **Jol: treated as a conference** (with all positives!), except ***correctness is expected to be checked more thoroughly***
 - Has its own “PC” (called “editorial board”, on rotating basis)
 - But only gets submissions which were:
 - submitted to Jol but ***not*** a conference
 - **“Jol accepted” by a conference** (then 3-4 conference PC members join the editorial board for this paper, and are expected to handle it till publication)

Resubmission

- **Initial reviews (and prior paper versions) stick**
- Must explain **changes from last version on front page**
- Options to be decided:
 - appendix detailing how prior comments were addressed?
 - limit number of resubmissions (esp. to conferences)?
 - “permanent reject” status (esp. for “junk papers”)?
 - force Eprint version for all accepts (or even submissions)?

What about Journal of Cryptology?

- **Becomes invitation-only (no direct subs)**
- Only gets few *best papers* from conferences or Jol
- Becomes more prestigious, and *read with interest* !
- Keeps (or improves!!) its high ISI index as a result

Summary

- Keeps positives from conferences
 - Fun reviewing, quick turnaround, prestige, ...
- Makes easier to publish in (and review for!) journals
 - Treats them as conferences with higher correctness bar
 - Seamless/fast transition from conference to journal
- Keeps one “paper directory”, sticky reviews, etc.
- Makes JoC relevant and higher quality
